## **Commonwealth Court Expansion**

In the ongoing effort to make eFiling a reality throughout the Pennsylvania Courts, PACFile has now been expanded to accept filings on cases heard in the Commonwealth Court.

For those who are already using PACFile, filings in the Commonwealth Court are created and managed using the same methods that are currently available for the Supreme Court. The options available in the PACFile filing wizards, such as the available docket and filing types, have been customized for the Commonwealth Court, but the overall process otherwise remains the same.

For anyone who is new to PACFile because of this expansion, the introduction of the Commonwealth Court offers an alternative means of filing on new and existing cases. This paperless system is a 24 hour, 7 day-a-week service that can be used to submit documents directly to the filing office, perform document service, pay filing fees, and view documents submitted on your cases by opposing counsel and the court. Onscreen instructions are provided throughout the existing screens to assist you with the various filing processes.

PACFile is available to all members of the Pennsylvania Bar who register for a UJS Web Portal account. This application is also available to non-attorneys, including pro se litigants, who have registered on the Web Portal. Pro Se litigants, however, are required to use a unique access code to file on any of their existing cases within PACFile. Moving forward, the code for each case will be provided by the court shortly following case initiation and it must be entered through the Manage Case Access Codes option on the PACFile Dashboard.

In addition to this court expansion, the following enhancement has been implemented exclusively for the Commonwealth Court:

## Introduction of Fillable Forms


Available only in certain scenarios, and designed specifically for pro se filers, a new fillable form option is available when filing a Petition for Review in the Commonwealth Court. In the Filing Documents tab of the filing wizard, the **Fill out an online PDF** dropdown can be used to generate a standardized PDF document that is formatted appropriately for Petitions for Review. These documents take much of the guesswork out of the court's document submission requirements and are partially completed by PACFile based on the relevant case information that has been entered through the filing wizard. PACFile cannot fill out these documents in full, however, so it is important

to review these documents and enter any missing information before saving and attaching the document to the filing. The filer's electronic signature is also applied to the form automatically so there is no need to complete this, or any other step in this process, outside of PACFile.



If you are using Chrome or Fire Fox for your web browser you may, depending on your personal settings, experience an issue with these fillable PDF forms. These browsers typically use a PDF viewer that is incompatible with these forms. The following provides tips for disabling these PDF viewers so you can use this PACFile feature:
